Statement by H.E. CHUM Sounry, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation Spokesperson:

In response to the statement issued by the Thai Ministry of Foreign Affairs on 2 August 2025, particularly its call for negotiations, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation of the Kingdom of Cambodia reaffirms its unwavering commitment to the peaceful resolution of all outstanding issues with Thailand. This commitment is grounded in international law and the principles outlined in the 2000 Memorandum of Understanding.

Cambodia has taken note of Thailand's call for negotiations and remains open to dialogue in good faith. However, the Ministry regrets that certain assertions contained in the statement do not accurately reflect the situation on the ground.

Cambodia calls on Thailand to match its words with concrete actions—by refraining from provocative measures, fully respecting the ceasefire agreement, and ensuring the humane treatment and prompt release of Cambodian military personnel currently under Thai control.

Cambodia calls on Thailand to demonstrate a genuine commitment to the peace process by strictly adhering to the agreed legal framework, ceasing all unilateral actions, and engaging constructively in dialogue based on mutually recognized documents. Cambodia has consistently shown its readiness to engage in good-faith negotiations in pursuit of a peaceful resolution.

Cambodia has fully committed to the implementation of the ceasefire agreement and remains open to sincere dialogue. We reaffirm our readiness to work closely with Thailand and relevant international partners to achieve a just, peaceful, and lasting resolution that serves the best interests of both nations and peoples.


Intervention by H.E. Pen Bona, Royal Government Spokesperson:

On this occasion, as the Royal Government Spokesperson, I'd like to once again express my heartfelt gratitude to all compatriots, both at home and abroad, who have united in support of peace and of our soldiers and armed forces and have raised their voices to call on the Thai side to release our 18 soldiers and facilitate their return to the country.

The voice of the Cambodian people, now resonating across the world, sends a clear message to the international community: Cambodia and its people seek to live in peace, free from all forms of aggression and violation. As a peace-loving nation, Cambodia does not invade or provoke any other country. What Cambodia firmly upholds is its sovereign right to defend its territorial integrity and to protect its honor and dignity against any form of invasion or disrespect.

As all Cambodian people deeply understand in their hearts, peace is the identity of Cambodia under the leadership of the Techo-Thipadei era. Our leaders regard the peace achieved through Samdech Techo Hun Sen's Win-Win Policy as more precious than anything else, a rare and invaluable achievement for Cambodia in the past 500 years.

In this regard, I'd like to once again emphasize to all compatriots that the ceasefire, which officially took effect at midnight on 28 July 2025, is the result of our leadership's sincere commitment to peace—strongly supported by leaders of major peace-loving nations who share our values. This ceasefire agreement has been warmly welcomed by numerous world leaders and is currently being implemented under the close and careful monitoring of the international community.

Keynote Address by H.E. LTG. Maly Socheata, the Ministry of National Defense Spokesperson:

1. On 3 August 2025, the second round of the field inspection tour will be conducted by the ASEAN Defence Attaché Observer Group, currently led on an interim basis by the Malaysian Defence Attaché. The delegation includes representatives from six countries: Indonesia, Laos, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, and Vietnam. The group will visit several key locations, particularly in Oddar Meanchey and Preah Vihear provinces, which have been among the areas most affected by the recent armed clashes between

the Cambodian and Thai militaries, to observe the implementation of the ceasefire agreement.

2. This field inspection tour follows the special meeting held on 28 July 2025 in Malaysia, which led to the ceasefire agreement and has since contributed to improved conditions along the border. During this visit, the ASEAN Defence Attaché Observer Group, currently led on an interim basis by the Malaysian Defence Attaché, will carry out its mission over a two-week period. The participation of these partner countries reflects a shared commitment to ensuring the ceasefire's success and longevity, with the ultimate goal of restoring peace, stability, cooperation, and development for the benefit of the peoples of both nations.

Intervention by H.E. Pen Bona, Royal Government Spokesperson:

On this occasion, as the spokesperson for the Royal Government, I would like to inform our fellow citizens, both at home and abroad, that throughout the implementation of the ceasefire agreement, the Royal Government, led by Samdech Moha Borvor Thipadei Hun Manet, continues to give the highest priority to both the frontlines and the rear. In particular, the Government prioritizes the formulation of policies to support our fallen

and wounded soldiers, as well as to assist displaced civilians who have been evacuated from conflict-affected areas and relocated to safe zones.

In particular, Her Excellency Dr. Pech Chanmony, the First Lady of Cambodia, has actively participated in memorial ceremonies honoring the fallen soldiers, visited wounded soldiers receiving treatment in hospitals, and met with evacuees in various safe shelter camps. At the same time, all of our national leaders, including Samdech Techo Hun Sen, President of the Senate; Samdech Kittipritth Bandit; Samdech Thipadei, the Prime Minister; and the First Lady of Cambodia, together with civil and military officials at all levels, have remained fully committed and tirelessly dedicated to carrying out their responsibilities.

This active engagement clearly demonstrates our leadership's deep commitment to peace, the welfare of our troops and armed forces, and the well-being of every citizen—ensuring that no one is left behind. In conclusion, our leadership stands in unwavering solidarity with all members of the armed forces and shares the concerns of every citizen in all circumstances.

Keynote Address by H.E. LTG. Maly Socheata, the Ministry of National Defense Spokesperson:

On August 3, 2025, the interim ASEAN Military Observer Group, comprising representatives from six countries—Indonesia, Laos, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, and Vietnam—departed from Phnom Penh for Oddar Meanchey and Preah Vihear provinces. These areas have been affected by recent armed clashes between Cambodian and Thai forces. The mission is led by Colonel Nazlee Bin Abdul Rahim, the Malaysian Defence Attaché to Cambodia. The purpose of this two-week mission is to monitor the implementation of the ceasefire on the ground. This activity follows the

outcome of the special meeting held on July 28, 2025, in Malaysia, which resulted in a mutual agreement on the ceasefire between the two sides.

The participation of these partner countries reflects a shared commitment to ensuring the success and sustainability of the ceasefire, with the ultimate goal of restoring peace, stability, cooperation, and development for the people of both nations.

As of now, 18 Cambodian military personnel remain in Thai custody following their capture at 7:50 AM on July 29, 2025. While two wounded personnel were returned to Cambodia on August 1, 2025, the remaining individuals have yet to be released.

The Royal Government of Cambodia continues to call on the Thai side to promptly repatriate the remaining personnel in accordance with international humanitarian law. Cambodia remains actively engaged in serious negotiations to resolve this matter and has formally requested Malaysia, in its capacity as ASEAN Chair, to mediate and press the Thai authorities to expedite their return. The Ministry of National Defence and the Royal Cambodian Armed Forces firmly reaffirm that we will never abandon any of our military personnel under any circumstances.
